Looking for mentors

The Council on Crime and Justice is looking for individuals to mentor men released from Minnesota state prisons. We recognize that returning from incarceration can be a challenging and stressful time; in order for a successful reintegration back into family and community life, support must be provided.

We are looking for individuals to support these men in their transitions by volunteering at group mentoring sessions. The commitment is minimal but the reward is great. We are asking for 4 to 6 hours per month.



Requirements

- Must be 21 or older;
- Must be off of probation or parole for at least one year;
- Must be comfortable working with individuals returning from prison and their families.

Group Mentoring

All volunteers will mentor men returning to prison in group mentoring sessions that occur at the Community Reentry Hub (Emerge) located at 1101 West Broadway Avenue, Suite 200 in Minneapolis. Group mentoring sessions meet once a week for approximately 90 minutes per week.

- Mentoring is a way to give back and serve, be recognized in the community for your service, and learn from others.
